Split Assembly - 15 February 2023

1. Bathroom Concerns
 - a. Discussion regarding the conditions of the bathrooms, general hygiene concerns
 - b. Any learner who knows which learners are vandalizing the bathrooms are encouraged to speak up.
 - c. Learners should take pride in their bathrooms, to be sure to leave the toilet stall in a clean condition for the next person to use. And not expect our cleaning staff to clean up mess.
 - d. At all times Bathroom stalls are to be used individually. Any learners found in a bathroom stall together, will be disciplined accordingly.
2. Uniform
 - a. Concerns were raised around the length of the girls' skirts. School skirt length is four fingers above the knee, as referenced in the code of conduct.
3. Hair
 - a. Hair is to be neatly tied back and out of the face, ensuring that the hair does not touch the ears, collar or eyebrows.
 - b. Learners wanting to colour their hair, needs to ensure that it is only one colour, and the colour must be natural. The colour is to be maintained.
 - c. Braids are allowed to have blue, white, red, or clear beads as ornaments.
 - d. All hair accessories should only be the school colours: red, blue, white or clear.
4. Jewelry
 - a. Only one set of earrings are to be worn in the earlobe of the ear.
 - b. No other piercings are allowed, only clear bristles are allowed to be used as place holders. No plasters are allowed to be worn, to cover piercings.
5. Relationships
 - a. Learners in a sexual relationship with someone who is two years older, needs to be aware that if one party is under the age of 16, this is constituted as statutory rape.
 - b. Even if the relationship is consensual – if an individual is under the age of 16.
6. Communication
 - a. Learners need to ensure that they are getting their parents to clearly communicate that they are not going to be at school. Parents need to ensure that they state why the learner can't be at school.

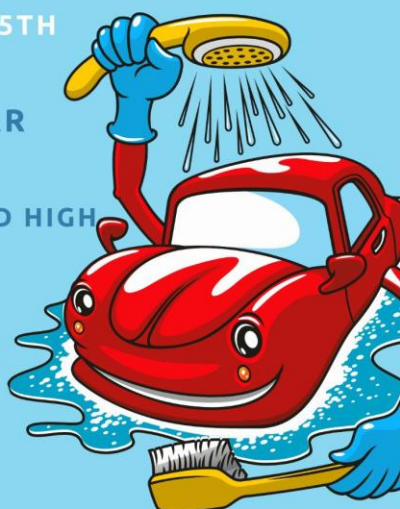
